CONVERSATION STARTERS

The most valuable preparation you can do is use your own words to tell the people you love or care about what you want life to look like when you're no longer around. Even if it's hard!

Preparing for a death chat

- 1. What's the purpose for your conversation? What do you hope to accomplish? What would the ideal outcome be?
- 2. How will the people you're talking to perceive the conversation? What are their needs and fears? What questions might they ask?
- 3. Understand what you're talking about. Have your will handy to refer to or make notes so you can communicate why you've made the decisions you have.
- 4. Use your conversation as an opportunity to discover what other people think and feel they're not necessarily going to be right but they may see the situation differently.
- 5. Acknowledge talking about death is hard and raises all kinds of emotions (your family might have different feelings than you do and that's ok).
- 6. Practice. Write down what you want to say and mentally practice the conversation; visualise yourself and the outcome you want. Imagine the questions you'll be asked and how you will answer them.
